From the 18th century to the 1980s, West Virginia was the largest coal producing region in America.


Today, West Virginia has:




- The nation's lowest labor participation rate

Clean water is scarce and difficult to access for Appalachians. Many do not have utility-scale access to water and instead must rely on local springs.






Mountaintop Removal (Strip Mining)



Today, it is a center for aquaponic research and production






Iron oxide acid mine drainage diverted...


